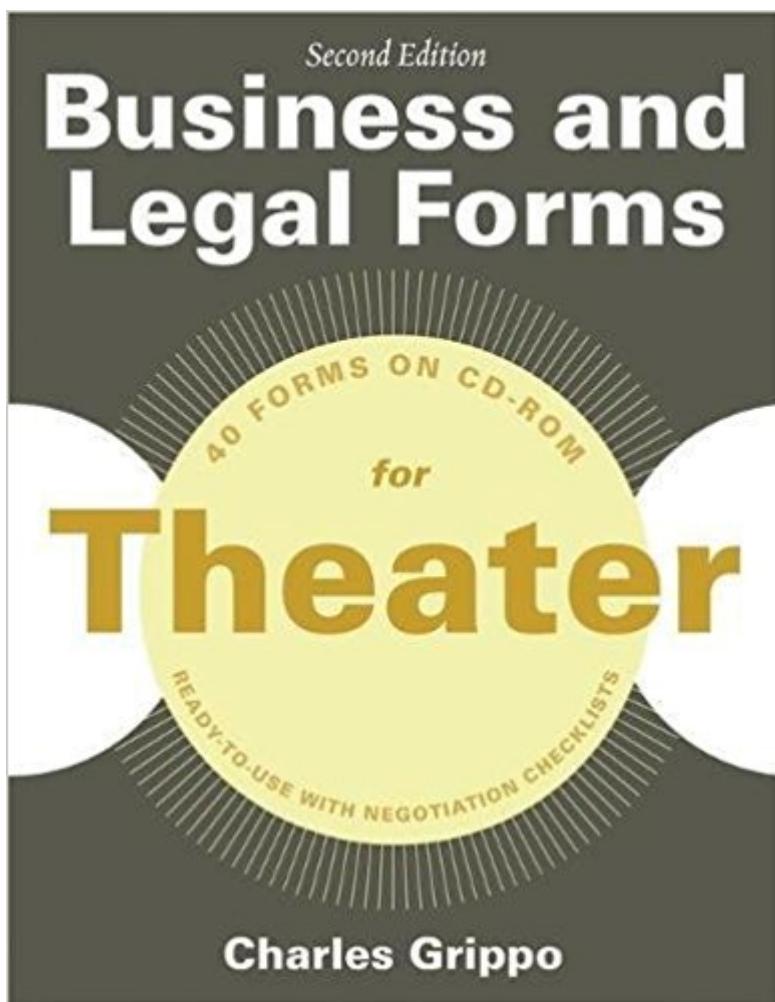


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# **Business And Legal Forms For Theater, Second Edition (Business And Legal Forms Series)**
