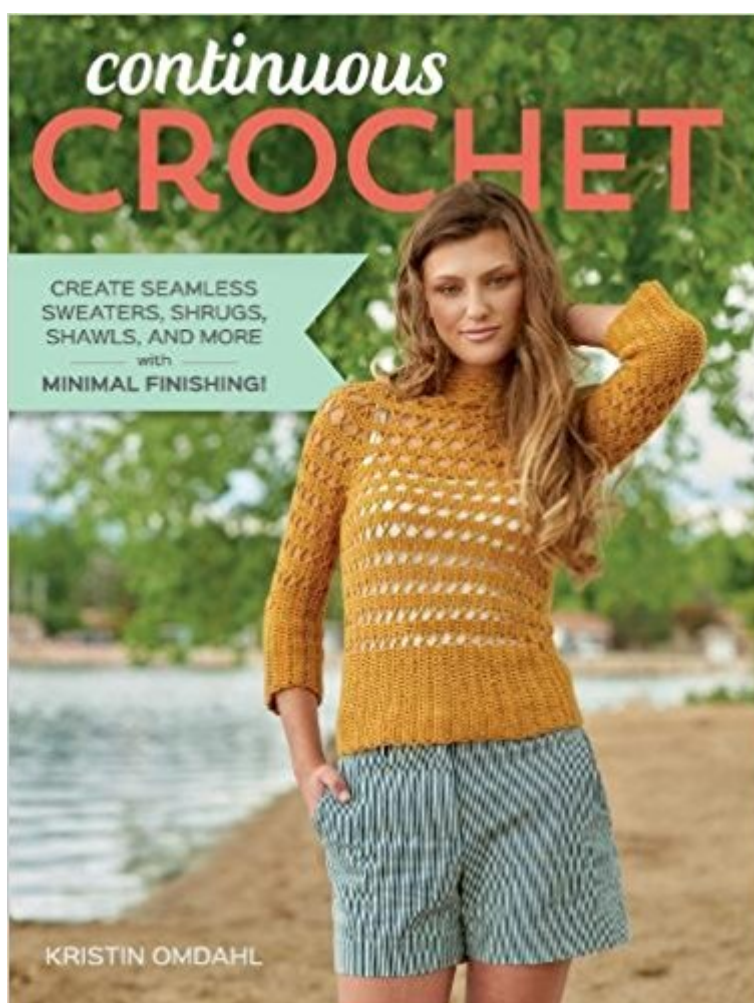

I LOVE Kristin Omdahl. Her patterns use a lot of circles and spirals (2 geometric shapes that I find aesthetically pleasing) and join-as-you-go techniques; there's very little cutting and reconnecting to be done, which makes weaving in ends super simple. I think I own all of her books and though she uses a similar ideas in a lot of her designs, none of them feel rehashed: every garment design is fresh and innovative.

Lots of great patterns in this book. There are many patterns in here that I would like to make, and I am currently working on one. Highly recommend.

This book is full of simple projects but nothing to ooh and aah over. The cover displays the only project that I would make and give. The other projects are not youthful or modern enough to be fashionable.

I got this as a gift for my mom, she loved it.....so I guess it's awesome.

OMG!!! My biggest problem with this book was deciding where to start! As always, Kristin has created a series of beautiful designs that are figure-flattering and up to the minute. I offered to make something for my daughter and daughter-in-law, and they BOTH want the Isle of Capri Motif Pullover created out of lacy square and triangular motifs. I love that one too, but I think we are too old for a "triplets" look! The Bed of Ferns Teardrop Lace Yoke Sweater is a favorite. The yoke shows off the openwork - almost like paper cuts, and the body is solid, perfect for showing off variegated yarn and even stitch work. My other favorites include the Twilight Skies Pentagon Motif Yoke Cardigan (again - extra interest at the yoke, and then chevrons cascading down over the body), the Monticello Meadow Cropped Pineapple Cardi (an adorable short cardi, perfect for an extra layer any time with classic pineapples in columns!), and the Coral Gables Cardi Wrap (which is an amazing long cardi-vest, showing off color blocking!). The shawls, especially the Ramblin' Rose Hairpin Lace Shawl, and the Sorrento Sunset Starburst Shawl are absolutely amazing! There

are also some smaller scale projects, even a scarf inspired by one of Kristin's own drawings! The fantastic Mardis Gras Gold Herringbone Cowl (I wear cowls most of the year) is Kristin's own Be So Sporty (Kristin Omdahl Yarns) and the Geisha Fan Petal Stitch Shrug is Be So Fine (Kristin Omdahl Yarns). I have worked with both of these 100% bamboo yarns, and they are as superior as Kristin's patterns! As always, Kristin's imaginative use of color, and ability to combine stitch work and design has produced a book that's a must-have for every crocheter's library!

I do like it and I'll tell you why: Kristin Omdahl uses many different types of crochet, yarns in different price ranges (including her own Bamboo So Fine - which you **MUST** try, it's so luxurious and not as expensive as you might expect) different kinds of project from the complicated fashionable to the t-shirt simple styling.
