

I know some have said the annotations were distracting, but honestly, they are in small red print and the actual story is in large (which is very appreciated) bolder black print. Therefore, you can easily read the story through without looking at the side notes. Afterward, read the side notes (annotations). So there you go.

I wanted an annotated edition of this because -- well, I just did, and this one is beautiful. It's a nice copy and pretty and also easy to read. The annotation doesn't interrupt the flow at all, but it's clear. It is also not about the writings of CS Lewis on the whole, just about these letters, which is great for me. Others may want a more in-depth comparison that goes deep into all of the writings. This is not that book, but the Letters themselves are great to read again and again, and this copy is a beauty. It

may be my favorite recent-ish purchase.

C.S. Lewis definitely achieves his goal "to throw light from a new angle on the life of men." The topics Srewtape explores provoke much personal thought and evaluation for believers. This is because the situations are real, and the ways the "Patient" is tempted are also real and have been experienced by most believers as they attempt to live a Christian life. The book is not full of Christian jargon and platitudes, but actually reveals truth about God, and about temptation. A clear knowledge of scripture would be helpful, but is not necessary to understanding. You need to read the introduction and preface which give insight into Lewis's purpose and beliefs about angels, "devils" (or demons) and Satan. Lewis's approach is very effective in helping us to see more clearly the reality of being a tempted rather than the generalities of temptation often taught, but not personally applied.

After so many years buying from "" I cannot believe I was not able to purchase a second copy of this book (as a present for my sister) because there is a "limit" and I already reached that limit of "one" book? Maybe if I were "someone" I would be able to enter Mr Bezos' VIP Club and get about a gazillion copies of this book. God bless. As per the book, well...five stars!

I'm one of those folks who don't enjoy reading fiction without lessons in there somewhere. One of our elderly ministers has been promoting the literature of C.S. Lewis for years. I bought this book thinking it would be very entertaining. It is, but in such an introspective way. A friend asked if it were an "easy read". Absolutely not! How anyone could have ever gotten so deeply into the minds of those of us who call ourselves Christians, I do not know. Lewis has certainly opened my eyes to my own vulnerability to the works of the Devil. I shudder to think what God would think were He to look into my eyes as the window to my soul!

One of his finest works. If you don't see yourself in one of Wormwood's "Patients" you aren't looking hard enough. Really nails the human condition and our proclivity to self-deception and evil, while making excuses. There is a reason this book is timeless. It speaks to the soul.

I bought this as a gift to someone so I spent the extra money on annotations and graphic design,

but if you're buying this book for yourself, you can save money by getting older and cheaper versions. Alternatively if you have serious Christian literature on your coffee table, you should get this version. This is an insightful (fiction) story describing many ways the devil tries to lead someone astray. While it is definitely a work of fiction, it still speaks truth.
