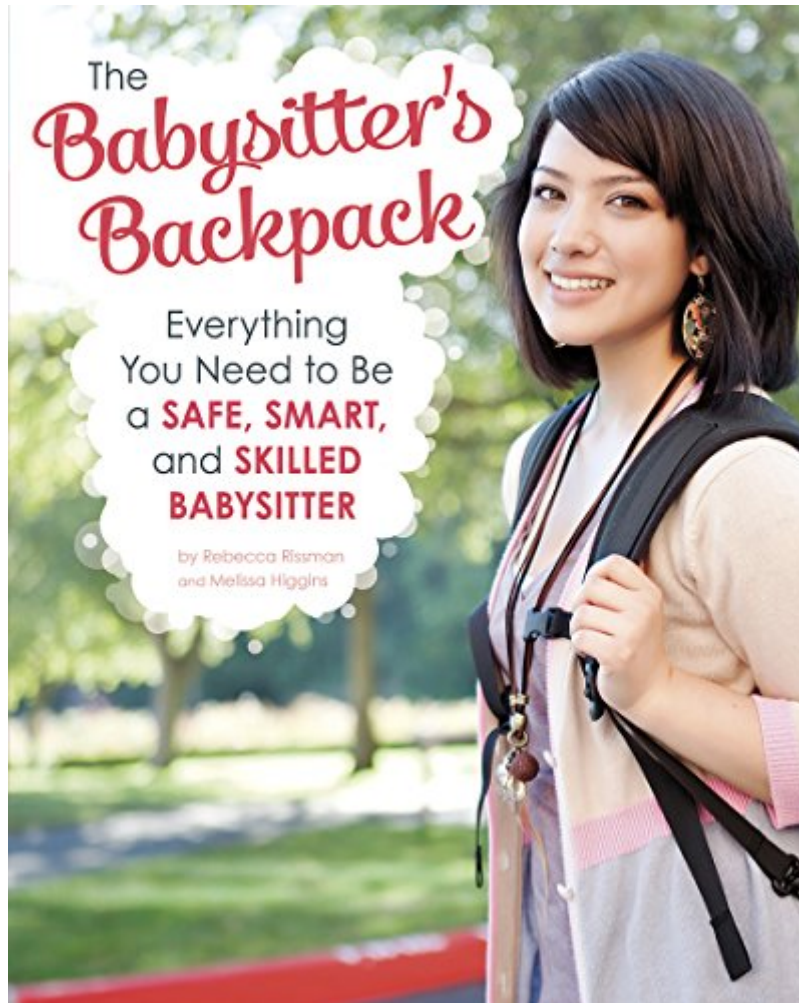

Readers will also learn tips on safety and how to be aware of their surroundings. Inside the pages readers will also find a handy babysitters checklist. When looking at babysitting as a business they will learn how to manage money, how to find just the right customers by asking certain questions during an interview by reviewing the list of suggested questions. Readers can get tips on what to carry in a backpack that could potentially become a briefcase. It can hold a journal, planner or calender, small bills, homework, a book or crafts and activities. The game ideas are wonderful. There are lots of toys at the house, but the kids get used to those. There are a bunch of easy to put together game ideas in this book. Unfortunately, this book does not go into detail for what to do in unavoidable emergencies such as tornadoes or fires. I'm sure most people already know what to do about those, but considering how often it talked about child safety, maybe these issues could have been addressed as well. Also, not everything is a choking hazard. According to this book, children shouldn't go to sleep with a stuffed animal or blankets, and they certainly should never sleep on their stomachs! First of all, my little brother has slept on his stomach for nearly a year now. And I babysit a little girl who always sleeps with a stuffed monkey. Does that raise their chances of suffocation? Possibly. Could they suffocate without those things? Possibly. Just do as the parents tell you to do. Would I recommend this book to other babysitters? Sure. While it sometimes goes over the top, there are also some great ideas in it.

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
