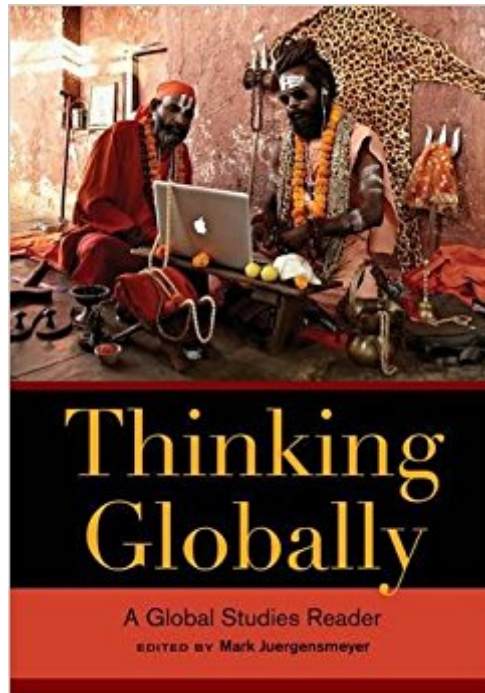


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Thinking Globally: A Global Studies Reader

Mark Juergensmeyer is Professor of Sociology and Global Studies and Director of the Orfalea Center for Global and International Studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. A scholar and writer best known for his studies of religious violence and global religion, he has also written on conflict resolution and on South Asian religion and society. He has authored or edited over twenty books, including *Global Rebellion: Religious Challenges to the Secular State* and the UC Press best-seller *Terror in the Mind of God: The Global Rise of Religious Violence*.

This is very useful as an introduction to Global Studies. Juergensmeyer writes in a simple, accessible style that will certainly interest many a beginner. I am using this book as the basis for a lecture series on Global Studies at Okayama University. For Kindle readers especially, the effort to simplify, on the other hand, can make it difficult to pursue references, as there are no textual notes, nor is there a bibliography as such. This latter takes form as a suggestion for further reading at the end of each section. It is difficult to find this in Kindle, as there is no reference to it in the 'Go To' function. Having overcome this problem, however, the references used form a great basis for newcomers to broaden their reading in this area.
