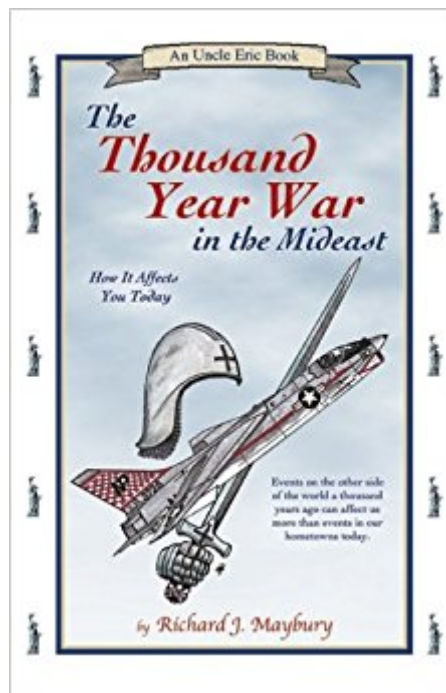




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The Thousand Year War In The Mideast: How It Affects You Today (An Uncle Eric Book)

Before actually venturing into the text, it is best to read the "Author's Disclosure," wherein Maybury makes plain his admittedly biased view about current affairs. He states that he adheres to Juris Naturalism-the belief that natural laws supersede laws created by governments. While certain statements, and the tone of the book in general, may strike some as outlandish and inflammatory, the author's research is sound and he does not confuse the facts. Instead, he uses them to promote his belief that the Middle East, or, rather, "Chaostan," a term coined by "Uncle Eric," is headed for a major world war. Basically, Maybury asserts that European and American governments have been exploiting Islamic countries for centuries to further their own political and economic purposes. Now, these countries are starting to rebel; thus, a world war is inevitable. The book is replete with excerpts from his Early Warning Report newsletter, which is advertised at the end. Although this title is certainly not "mainstream" research, it definitely provides an easy-to-read argument for, as Maybury states, "liberty, free markets, and international neutrality." Some concepts:The non-statist side of U .S. foreign policy has been erased from schools, the news media and the entertainment media.The Mideast war is not over.Yesterday's [retaliation](#) is now called terrorism.Political power is the most deadly, addictive narcotic ever

discovered. The Bill of Rights stops at the border. It does not protect foreigners. Therefore, American powerseekers turn their attention toward foreigners. The American republic had hardly emerged from its cradle when it gave up its neutrality and sided with the Europeans against the Moslems on the shores of Tripoli. During the U.S. conquest of the Philippines, General Jacob Smith told his troops to take no prisoners. 220,000 Filipino men, women and children were slaughtered. It's not good for morale. It's Satanic to send good men to fight guerrillas. It was ethnic cleansing just like in Bosnia. In Vietnam, the U.S. dropped 1,000 pounds of explosives for each man, woman and child in the country. U.S. troops are stationed in 144 countries. They train foreign troops to do the anti-guerrilla dirty work that Washington will not do. Killing soldiers and civilians is an acceptable part of war, but killing politicians is definitely immoral and a horrible crime. Moslems perfected assassinations. Whoever appears to be responsible isn't who is responsible. In Eastern Europe and Asia, religion is politics. The area has a nuclear Hindu bomb (India), a nuclear Islamic bomb (Pakistan), a nuclear Eastern Orthodox bomb (Russia) and a nuclear Jewish bomb (Israel). At one time American troops risked their lives fighting for liberty, then it was degraded to democracy and now it is interests. Why die for an interest? President Clinton bombed and killed 2,000 Iraqis on December 16, 1998 the day before his impeachment was to be voted on. He said it was to protect the national interest of the United States. Iraq was a little tin-pot dictatorship with an economy the size of South Carolina. Yet the U.S. had to use fully half its non-nuclear military force and spend tens of billions of dollars in a single month. The U.S. got a stalemate for its efforts. The U.S. government and the United Nations have little interest in liberty. Liberty would drastically reduce their power. They want democracy, majority rule (mob rule). All 22 Islamic governments are ruthless dictatorships that represent no one but themselves. All these tyrants worry about rebellion and assassination. There is little Americans can do to broker an end to war because the American government has thrown away its neutrality. Saddam Hussein was insane but not stupid. Most of the Iraqi troops slaughtered by U.S. troops were not Sunnis, they were Shiites, the people who wanted to overthrow Saddam. In a single battle, at Stalingrad in WWII, more people were killed than America has lost in all the wars it has ever fought. The Soviet Socialists murdered millions of Moslems in conquering Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, Kirgizstan, Tajikistan and Azerbaijan. Yugoslavia was an artificial country cobbled together from diverse groups of enemies. Tito's constitution was just six words, if you make trouble you die. The only foreign policy that would be good for America is neutrality. Presidents call neutrality isolationism. Governments can't stand ridicule. Once bureaucrats, police and

troops are embarrassed to be part of the institution, their morale drops, they quit doing their jobs. If you really want to fight back against the ruling elite, compile a list of jokes about them and pass them around. Machiavellianism is the acquisition and maintenance of political power by a ruler who has no ethics. Since the Soviet Union has fallen apart, NATO's purpose is undefined. The U.N. is slowly evolving into a world government.
