

Currently creative director at Tricktones LLC, a music production company, Sullivan spent the past 15 years as an executive with music magazines, holding positions at Spin and Entertainment Weekly. Previously, he created Vertigo Magazine, a cutting-edge guide for adventurous tourists in New York City, and Linx, a step-by-step walking guide through the streets of Amsterdam, Holland.

In the new modern way of accessing information this book offers up a clean path and the interviews with the Vice Presidents of major music organizations has come in handy, for me at least. This book was obviously written by a person who knows how the music scene in Nashville works. After reading *Making the Scene*, I feel much more focused, realistic, and prepared to jump into the Nashville industry. If you're thinking about moving to Nashville as a songwriter or musician, or you already live there and need some help to get more comfortable and

develop a better focus, this book is an absolute must-have.
