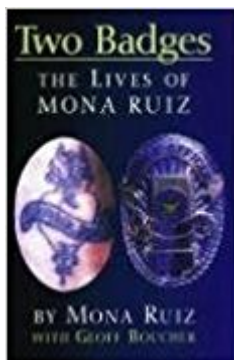

Devoid of direction, ignorant and unguided young people are prey for bad influences; here lies the timeless threat to every young girl. After a surreal marriage to a drug addict and a pregnancy, Ruiz does the impossible and becomes a cop. This book has the qualities of becoming an urban classic because not much has changed since Ruiz was a girl. That's a bittersweet commentary when a Latino can be the mayor of Los Angeles (Villaraigosa) and yet Latino youth can still be utterly lost to the street. I'd like to see the retired Mona Ruiz write her memoirs and tell us where her life finally led her. Hopefully she's at peace with her identity and her role in life.
